Answer is salt and pepper appearance- classically seen in scleroderma. Subtle clue in the question "thick skin" is an important finding in scleroderma. The salt-and-pepper appearance is characterized by the presence of vitiligo-like depigmentation with perifollicular pigmentary retention. The rich capillary network surrounding the hair follicle preserves melanogenesis, and hence the retained perifollicular pigmentation in systemic sclerosis

Vitiligo will have diffuse hypopigmentation but absence of thick skin and perifollicular pigment retention.

In Eczema skin become inflamed, itchy, erythematos, coarse, with or without scaling.

Photosensitive rash following exposure to uv light is termed as polymorphic light eruption. It can manifest as almost any type of lesion, to include papules, plaques, or vesicles

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
