

Digital gangrene is most often seen in small vasculitis (among the options provided). Some of the examples of small vessel vasculitis are Wegener's, Churg-Strauss and microscopic polyangiitis (ANCA vasculitis).

Large vessel vasculitis like Takayasu and Giant cell arteritis will never have digital gangrene due to development of collateral.

Medium vessel vasculitis like Polyarteritis nodosa will have more of abdominal symptoms and vasculitic non-healing ulcers.

Primary Raynaud's is a reversible phenomenon and hence digital gangrene is not commonly seen with it.

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
